## CelticMKE Edward J. Ward Irish Music Scholarship Application ~ 2017

The Edward J. Ward Irish Music Scholarship was established in 1989 by resolution of the Board of Directors of Irish Festivals, Inc., to honor Edward J. Ward, founder of the Milwaukee Irish Fest and promoter of Irish activities in the Milwaukee area.

The \$1,000 yearly scholarship for musicians or singers is to be used for their study or for projects related to Irish instrumental music or song. Applicants may be of any age or ethnic background and need not be residents of the Milwaukee area.

The Scholarship Committee anticipates announcing the Edward J. Ward Irish Music Scholarship recipient during Milwaukee Irish Fest in August. Winners will be given \$500 in August of the award year. The remaining \$500 will be awarded <u>only</u> upon the committee's receipt of the grantee's report, including evidence (such as receipts and registration forms) that the project was completed.

- 5. Feel free to provide any other information you think might be relevant for the Scholarship Committee to adequately appraise your application.
- 6. Provide <u>at least</u> one letter of recommendation from a current teacher stating how you would benefit from the scholarship. Your application will also be strengthened if you can provide one or more letters of reference from an unrelated person(s). All letters of recommendation and reference should be e-mailed or sent to the CelticMKE office under separate cover. They should *not* be included with your application. They are due in our office by the same date as your application.

The scholarship recipient will be notified no later than August 1<sup>st</sup>. All applicants will be notified of the committee's decision. If you have any questions, please contact the committee at MusicScholarship@CelticMKE.com.
